

Benefits of Belonging

“Working at those things we can do better together”

The purpose of this document is to give a picture to congregations of the benefits we gain from belonging to Mennonite Church British Columbia.

A definition of Anabaptist/Mennonite: (“Anabaptism” is more of a movement and “Mennonite” is a specific church group, yet the terms are often used interchangeably.) The basics of being Anabaptist/Mennonite include: baptism upon the confession of personal faith in Christ, following Christ in all areas of life, worship and discernment of God’s truth as a community, being nonviolent peacemakers, and commitment to helping others.

1. The “Confession of Faith in a Mennonite Perspective” is our statement of how we interpret Scripture and how we seek to live in faithfulness to Christ. We, together with the people of the Mennonite Church across Canada and the USA, discerned what we wanted to say about what we believe. It was approved, published and made available to the church in 1995.
