We continue to visit the five Tokyo Area Fellowship of Mennonite churches (TAFMC) where

Gerald speaks, and Rie often plays piano. We'd like to acknowledge the retirement of Pastor Inamine and his wife Hiroko of the Minuma Church. At age 86, he's been struggling due to illness. With his



retirement, the few remaining

church members decided it's time to close the church. He is one of the pioneer leaders in TAFMC. The Mennonite pastors have limited salaries, small house churches, and hardly any pension provided. This

At the monthly Lay-leader Training, we have had the opportunity to learn from a variety of speakers, including retired Anabaptist/Mennonite professors. Since we do not have any Mennonite schools, people have found this to be a very valuable opportunity to learn theology. Most recently, Gordon Zerbe, a New Testament professor from Canadian Mennonite University, gave a series of presentations teaching about each of the Gospels and the Acts of the



Apostles. We always have a lively discussion during these sessions, and many are excited to learn new areas as we dig deeper into the bible. These days, other sessions include updates on Ukraine and Gaza by MCC

> representatives, and a three-part series on the first chapters of Genesis by Professor Dan Epp-Tiessen.



International Christian University peace workshop

Gerald has had the opportunity to lead a few workshops on conflict transformation at International Christian University. Early in the year he had the privilege of leading one class, as a guest lecturer. He focused on the challenge of polarization and dualistic thinking which divides people into opposing groups.

Some of the students were

interested in learning more about Mennonite perspectives on peacebuilding. They were very interested in Jesus' words about loving enemies, as well as Christian perspectives on forgiveness. I think it was good to get to know the university staff and make new connections beyond TAFMC. As we build relationships, our ministry becomes richer.

Every Saturday morning, members of our family volunteer to participate in an outdoor chapel at Yoyogi park. This is organised by an ecumenical Christian group. Worship services are held early on Saturday mornings, and food and various items are provided for people living on the street. Honancho Church has been supporting this ministry for many years. More than 100 people join the group each week.
